Our pedagogical offer includes the undergraduate London Theatre Program, accredited by Sarah Lawrence College; the Midsummer in Oxford Program, aimed at actors at all stages of their careers and delivered in association with the David Geffen School of Drama at Yale; and in-house programmes including Black British Theatre and Performance, Greek Theatre; and our Midsummer Conservatory for 16–18-year-olds. BADA offers US and international students rare opportunities to immerse themselves in classical theatre under the guidance of leading British, European and American actors, directors and teaching artists, and to experience the richness of the UK's theatrical heritage.
